(5) West Central Emergency Rural Theft
Deterrence & Apprehension Program

The Macoupin County Sheriff's Department in cooperation with those of Calhoun, Christian, Greene, Jersey and Montgomery and West Central has requested the following four phase program for emergency assistance.

Phase I. Mutual Aid Agreements between participating counties. Each participating county will sign an agreement with each other participating county permitting its County Sheriff to volunteer help to the other participating county or counties if requested to do so by the County Sheriff. This makes legal what has been done informally for a long time and will greatly increase available protection for rural residents. This means that if rural livestock theft is reported near Farmersville and the Montgomery County cars are in rural Donnellson the Sheriff could ask the Macoupin County car near Girard to answer the call until his own car could get there. The program is entirely voluntary. The Sheriff of any of the counties cannot be compelled to lend assistance and no other county car can answer another county's calls unless requested to do so by the resident county.

Phase II. Guaranteed Hiring of Additional Patrolmen*, Macoupin County would receive funds for 720 extra 8-hour shifts (5760 hours) of experienced county law enforcement personnel at \$25/shift. Sheriff to decide level of experience, when to hire, etc. Value to Macoupin County \$18,936.00 including social security contribution.

Phase III. Emergency Response Pool. The six sheriffs will have an additional pool of 1280 hours or 160 shifts to draw from in emergency situations.

Phase IV. Public Information Program. The Commission will receive \$1600 to develop and administer a public information program to the farm communities of the six counties in cooperation with farm organizations explaining steps rural residents can take to deter thefts.

*Under terms of grant Calhoun County would receive 360 shifts, Christian 360, Greene 540, Jersey 540, and Montgomery 720 shifts.

ORDINANCE CONCERNING REDUCTION IN THE PRIVILEGE TAX ON OWNERS OF MOBILE HOMES

WHEREAS, Public Act 78-375, entitled, "An Act to Provide for a Privilege Tax on Mobile Homes," has been approved by the Illinois General Assembly and has been signed by the Governor of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Section 7 of said Act authorizes a reduction in said tax for persons aged 65 or older who further comply with the requirements of said Section 7; and

WHEREAS, Section 7 of said Act directs the County Board to determine the procedure for determining the eligibility of such persons to qualify for such reduction in tax;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF MACOUPIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS follows:

Section 1. That in order to qualify for the reduction in the privilege tax on owners of mobile homes as authorized in Section 7 of "An Act to Provide for a Privilege Tax on Mobile Homes", approved August 28, 1973 (Public Act 78-375) the owner of a mobile home who desires to apply for such reduction shall file with the Supervisor of Assessments of Macoupin County, Illinois, an application for such reduction on forms to be furnished by said Supervisor of Assessments. Such application shall require the owner of such mobile home to furnish information and proof concerning the following items as specified in Section 7 of said Act, to-wit:

- (a) that the owner actually resides in such mobile home; and
(b) that the owner holds title to such mobile home as provided in the "Illinois Vehicle Code", approved September 29, 1969, as amended; and
(c) that the owner is 65 years of age or older; and
(d) that the owner has an annual net income, as provided in Article II of the "Illinois Income Tax Act", approved July 1, 1969, as amended, of \$4,000.00 or less.

The application and proof hereinbefore enumerated shall be filed with the County Supervisor of Assessments or with the Township Assessor. In the event said application and proof is filed with the Township Assessor, such Assessor shall forward or deliver such application and proof to the County Supervisor of Assessments within 7 days after said application and proof is filed with such assessor.

Section 2. No reduction in the privilege tax on owners of mobile homes shall be made unless and until the application and proof hereinbefore mentioned are filed with and approved by the County Supervisor of Assessments. Upon such application and proof being forwarded by the owner and approved by the Supervisor of Assessments, the Supervisor of Assessments shall furnish such information to the County Clerk. Upon receipt of such information from the Supervisor of Assessments, the County Clerk shall reduce the privilege tax of such owner to 80 per cent of the tax otherwise provided for in Section 3 of the "Act to Provide for a Privilege Tax on Mobile Homes", and such reduction shall be reflected in the tax bill which the County Clerk is directed to issue pursuant to Section 6 of said Act.
