COURIER PICKUP SERVICE A REALITY

State Rep. John F. Sharp (D-East Alton) has announced that a courier pickup service to provide better diagnostic services to West Central Illinois livestock producers will begin on January 3.

Each weekday an Illinois Department of Agriculture driver will collect specimens from designated pickup points throughout the region and return them to the Department's Galesburg Laboratory for analysis. Locations where veterinarians may leave specimens are the Greene County Jail in Carrollton, the Pike County Jail in Pittsfield, the Brown County Courthouse in Mt. Sterling, the Schuyler County Sheriff's Office in Rushville, and the Hancock County Sheriff's Office in Carthage.

"I was first made aware of the need for better diagnostic services several years ago when Harry Wright, Jr., Agricultural Extension Advisor for Pike County, came to me and asked for my help," Sharp explained. "After more than two years of legislative effort, the courier pickup service has become a reality.

"I must emphazize, however," he continued, "that the courier pickup service is being instituted on a trial basis. If West Central Illinois farmers want the service to continue, they must utilize it through their veterinarians."

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A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE ABANDONED MINE LAND RECLAMATION COUNCIL OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS TO MAKE FURTHER IMPROVEMENTS CONCERNING ABANDONED MINES IN MACOUPIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the Land Reclamation Council of the State of Illinois, acting in conjunction with the Department of Mines and Minerals, has undertaken a Reclamation Project in Staunton, Macoupin County, Illinois, known as Consolidated Coal Company #14 Mine, and

WHEREAS, the Macoupin County Board of Supervisors deeply appreciates the efforts made by the State of Illinois and the Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Council in choosing Macoupin County for this pilot project, as it will not only provide recreational facilities for the City of Staunton, but will remove an eyesore and help to stop the pollution of Cahokia Creek Watershed, and

WHEREAS, there are many more Abandoned Mines in Macoupin County, which are not only eyesores, but are causing subsidences of the surface lands therefore causing house and buildings to sink and crack; and further causing pollution of streams and watersheds.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Macoupin County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION I. That the Macoupin County Board of Supervisors Macoupin County, Illinois, hereby request the Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Council to further investigate surface land subsidences, pollution of streams, watersheds and lakes, with a view toward making additional expenditures of funds to correct these problems by abandoned mine sites in this County.

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A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY TO INCREASE FUNDS FOR THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE

WHEREAS, at the present time the County Cooperative Extension State Law provides that the State of Illinois provide a 25% match of the County budget from the Agricultural Premium Fund, for the funding of the University of Illinois Cooperative Extension Service, and

WHEREAS, this matching principal was established in 1972 as a way to accommodate the funding of the Cooperative Extension service to shifts that were taking place in the system of taxation in the State of Illinois, so that the Counties could participate in the Extension Service, and

WHEREAS, Inflation and changes in the assessment rate, together with new budget demands have all played a part in creating very tight County budgets, so that now most Counties have not been able to provide for adequate local funding at the 25% matching level.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Macoupin County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION I. That the Macoupin County Board of Supervisors hereby request the Illinois General Assembly, and the Governor of the State of Illinois to increase the State share of the match from the Agricultural Premium Fund from a 25% rate to a 50% rate thereby; reducing pro-rata the amount the County of Macoupin must appropriate for the University of Illinois Cooperative Extension Service.

SECTION II. That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the State Senator and the State Representatives from the 49th District, and to the Governor of the State of Illinois.
