Pursuant to Article IV, Section 9 (b) of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, I hereby veto and return House Bill 32 entitled "AN ACT providing for the full amount of the salary of circuit court judges and associate judges to be paid by the State."

House Bill 32 transfers all but \$500 of Circuit and Associate Judges' supplemental salaries from the Counties to the State.

The \$3.9 million involved is not included in my proposed budget. I do agree that the State should assume responsibility for payment to Judges, but the funds will have to be phased in over a period of several years. I therefore, veto and return House Bill 32.

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE CONTROL OF ANIMALS IN MACOUPIN COUNTY ILLINOIS

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF MACOUPIN COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Section I: DEFINITIONS

"DOGS"

The Word dog whenever used in this resolution unless specifically designated otherwise, shall include all members of the canine family whether male or female, 3 months of age or older, and shall also include pet foxes and wolves.

"OWNER OF KEEPER"

The word owner or keeper means any person having the right of property in, or who keeps or harbors a dog, or who has a dog in his care or custody, or who acts as its custodian, or who knowingly permits and lets a dog remain on or about any premises occupied by him.

"BITCH"

The work bitch shall mean a female canine.

"RUNNING AT LARGE"

It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog to permit the same to run at large upon any public street, alley, parkway, public place or unenclosed place within the County. Any dog found in or upon any public street, alley, parkway, public place or unenclosed place within the County shall be impounded as hereinafter provided and the owner or keeper shall upon conviction be subject to penalties as herein provided.

Running at large shall be construed to mean allowing a dog to leave the private premises of the owner or keeper while not under direct, effective and actual supervision and control of the said owner or keeper or his agent or servant.

Section III: "DANGEROUS DOGS"

It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any dog, known to be dangerous, fierce or vicious by the owner or keeper, to run at large on any public street, alley, parkway, public premises of any person other than the owner or keeper, and any dog found in violation of this section shall be impounded as hereinafter provided and the owner or keeper shall upon conviction, suffer penalties provided for herein.

Section IV: "DISTURBING THE PEACE - DOG BITES"

It is unlawful for any dog to unduly disturb the quiet of any person or neighborhood within the County; or any dog which shall bite any person or persons or injure any person or persons so as to cause an abrasion of the skin in any manner that the skin breaks, is hereby declared to be a Public nuisance and such dog shall immediately be impounded and the owner or keeper upon conviction, shall suffer the penalties provided for herein.

Section V: "BITCHES IN HEAT"

It shall be unlawful for any owner or keeper of any bitch to suffer or permit the same to run at large in the County while in heat and any bitch found running at large, shall be immediately impounded and the owner or keeper upon conviction, shall suffer the penalties provided for herein.

Section VI: "DUTY OF OWNER OF KEEPER"

Whenever an owner or keeper of any dog has knowledge of or has been notified in any manner that such dog has bitten or injured any person to cause abrasions of the skin or any breakage of the skin of such person; or is suffering from rabies, he shall forthwith deliver said dog to the Animal Control Warden, Rabies Control Officer, County Veterinarian, or any Peace Officer in Macoupin County, whereupon said dog shall be securely confined for a period of not less than 10 days for observation in the County Dog Pound by the County Veterinarian. Upon appearance or any symptoms of rabies, said dog is to be confined until death and then its head is to be removed in such a manner as not to disturb any brain cells of said dog, and the head is to be delivered to the Department of Public Health for examination and pathological findings consistent with rabies control. At the end of said 10 day observation period, if no symptoms of rabies have occurred, the dog is to be returned to the owner or keeper upon payment of the fees required herein. However, the said dog is to be vaccinated for rabies prior to the time that it is returned and all County taxes must be paid thereon.

Section VII: "DUTY OF VETERINARIANS, PEACE OFFICERS AND OTHER PUBLIC OFFICIALS"

It shall be the duty of every veterinarian or peace officer of Macoupin County who shall discover or know of any dog or other animal suffering from or showing symptoms of rabies, to report such fact immediately to the Rabies Control Officer, County Veterinarian or Animal Control Warden giving the name and place of residence, if known, of the person owning or keeping such dog, and the place where the dog or other animal can be found. Such dog shall thereupon be immediately impounded for a period of 10 days as provided for in the processing Section.

Section VIII:

All dogs impounded under Section VII may at the discretion of the owner or keeper of such dog, in lieu thereof, at his own expense, deliver such dog to a licensed veterinarian within the County for observation. Such dog shall thus be confined by the veterinarian for observation for the 10 day period, provided the veterinarian shall before returning any such dog to the owner or keeper, notify the Public Health Department at least 24 hours prior to the time said dog is returned.

Section IX: "INOCULATION FOR RABIES"

It shall be unlawful to permit or allow any dog to be on any public street, alley, parkway, sidewalk, park or in any public place in the County other than in an enclosed area on the owner's or keeper's premises, unless the dog is inoculated for rabies by a licensed veterinarian within the preceding year. Any dog in violation of this Section shall be impounded as provided for herein and the owner or keeper upon conviction, shall suffer penalties provided for herein.

As evidence of such rabies inoculation, a rabies tag is to be issued by the County Board at a fee established by the Board for each dog inoculated for rabies. Every owner or keeper of a dog shall cause such dog to be inoculated for rabies. Every owner or keeper of a dog shall cause such dog to be inoculated for rabies by a licensed veterinarian at such intervals as established by regulations effectuated by the Macoupin County Board. In addition to the rabies inoculation tag provided by the County Board, a certificate of inoculation, signed by a licensed veterinarian shall be presented to the owner or keeper as evidence of the inoculation.

Section X:

"IMPOUNDMENT"

It shall be the duty of the Animal Control Warden or any Assistant Warden or any Peace Officer of Macoupin County to take up and impound any and all dogs running at large in violation of any Provision or Section of this resolution. Said dog shall be impounded in the manner provided for herein. In the capture of any Dog, said Animal Control Warden, Assistant Warden, or any Peace Officer is authorized to use reasonable force, if necessary, to capture said dog. They are directed to use any traps, nets, chemicals or tranquilizer gun if it is reasonably necessary.

Section XI:

"SERVICE OF NOTICE OF IMPOUNDMENT"

A. All dogs impounded herein shall be kept enclosed in the Macoupin County Animal Control Shelter which is a licensed facility located in Carlinville, Macoupin County, Illinois.

B. After any dog has been impounded as provided herein by the Animal Control Warden or any Assistant Warden or any Peace Officer of Macoupin County, the animal control Warden of Macoupin County shall give notice of not less than 7 days to the owner or keeper of said dog, when the said dog has a County approved inoculation tag attached to the said dog and there is a valid certificate of inoculation issued to the owner or keeper by the County Clerk.

C. In the event that the owner or keeper of the said dog cannot be identified, then the dog shall be designated as a "stray dog" and the Macoupin County Animal Control Shelter shall keep the stray dog for at least 3 days before the dog is destroyed.

D. Whenever the owner or keeper of any Dog impounded under this resolution desires to recover his animal, he may do so under the following conditions; to Wit:

1. Present a certificate of inoculation for Rabies reflecting proper inoculation of the Dog, and also present proof of payment to the veterinarian.

2. Pay for the Rabies inoculation of the Dog, if the animal is not inoculated, and also pay the Macoupin County Clerk \$2.00 for the County Dog tag. Said money to be placed in the Animal Control Fund.

3. Pay to the Macoupin County Animal Control Shelter, \$2.00 per day for room and board of the Dog for the period of the time that said Dog was impounded. Said fee to be deposited in the General Revenue Account.

Section XII:

The County of Macoupin shall charge to each municipality in Macoupin County an additional fee of \$4.00 for each dog voluntarily brought to the Macoupin County Animal Control Shelter and an additional fee of \$6.00 if the County of Macoupin is called upon by the municipality to pick up the dog in their municipality. The said fee is to be collected by the County Clerk from the municipality which requested that the Dog be impounded in the Macoupin County Animal Control Shelter.

The County Clerk shall submit a bill to the City Clerk of the municipality for each dog. In the event that the municipality fails or refuses to pay the said bill, after a reasonable period of time, not to exceed 60 days, the same shall become a lien on the Municipality Tax Fund in the County Treasurer's office and may be enforced and collected by the County in like manner and form as other County liens. Funds collected under this Section shall be deposited in the General Revenue Account.

Section XIII:

In addition to the foregoing fees and penalties provided for in this Resolution, the owner or keeper of a Dog upon conviction of a violation of any Section or Provision of this Resolution, shall pay a fine of not less than \$25.00, not more than \$50.00, for the first offense, and not less than \$50.00, not more than \$100.00 for each subsequent offense.

Section XIV;

Any and all Resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed and if any Section or Part of this Resolution is subsequently declared to be invalid for any reason, it shall not affect the remainder herein.




