If the property is depreciable and is listed on the National Register or located in a district listed on the National Register, there are also certain provisions of the Tax Reform Act of 1976 that may apply. Section 2124 of the Tax Reform Act of 1976 encourages preservation of historic buildings by elimanating certain otherwise available federal tax benefits both for demolition of historic structrues and for new construction on the site of demolished historic buildings. Moreover, if the property contains coal resources and is listed on the National Register, certain provisions of the Surface Mining and Control Act of 1977 make it less likely that surfact mining of the coal will be permitted by the State of federal government.
