PUBLIC NOTICE

Proposed Dam and Reservoir Across a Tributary to Honey Creek in Brushy Mound Township, Macoupin County, Illinois

Notice is hereby given all interested parties that an application has been received from Mr. Randall Loveless, R. R. # 3, Carlinville, Illinois 62626 for a permit authorizing the construction of an intermediate size dam in the "significant hazard potential" category across a tributary to Honey Creek approximately 3 miles south of Carlinville, Illinois.

The plans show that the proposed work consists of constructing an earthen fill dam to impound a 116-acre reservoir for water supply. The earthen dam will be approximately 645 feet long and approximately 50 feet high measured from the top of the dam to the streambed at the downstream toe of the dam. The top width will be 20 feet with a downstream side slope of 2 1/2:1 and an upstream side slope of 2 1/2:1 protected with riprap. The principal spillway is a reinforced concrete drop inlet structure with the earth embankment. The emergency spillway is an earthcut section located at the left abutment of the dam. The total area of the watershed serving the proposed reservoir is 2.2 square miles. The dam will be located in the Northeast Quarter of Section 14 in Township 9 North, Range 7 West of the Third Principal Meridian in Brushy Mound Township of Macoupin County, Illinois.

No work is to be commenced or completed on this project unless and until such time as the permit is issued. A preliminary determination indicates that authorization from the United States Department of the Army Corps of Engineers may also be required for this project.

RESOLVED: That this attached Permit and Authority is granted by the Macoupin County Board to the Union Electric Company, Permit dated June 20, 1980 for the South end of Seminary Road County Highway No. 8, subject to the following limitations and conditions:

1. Union Electric shall indemnify and save harmless the County, County Superintendent of Highways, and their agents and employees against all claims, expenses, loss and liability on account of injury or death of persons, or damage to property caused by or arising out of the construction, existence, maintenance or operation of any electric lines under this Resolution, or the exercise of any electric lines under this Resolution, or the exercise of any other rights hereby granted.
2. Union Electric upon written request of the Superintendent of Highways will, relocate, adjust, change or rearrange any of its electric lines and appurtenances at its liability and entire expense whenever it is necessitated by highway relocation, reconstruction, construction, maintenance, or improvements.
3. That Union Electric will be liable for the entire cost of relocating or damage to all existing utilities caused by the construction, maintenance and repair to their own electric lines.
4. Union Electric shall take all necessary precautions by use of signs, signals, flagmen, or watchmen, to protect the general public and all reasonable measures to cause least interference with traffic movement along the roadways where construction or maintenance is in progress. All traffic control shall be in accordance with the State of Illinois "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices" and amendments thereof.




