Since the closing of the range in Bunker Hill the only logical alternative is to send this officer to the closest facility available.

The West Central Law Enforcement Commission in Jerseyville sponsors this training at no charge to you if you have the training in this 10 county district. There are two places to get training and they are at the South Central Rifle & Pistol Club Range who has 2 instructors who train these officers for West Central or send your men to Quincy which is quite a drive when you have to pay you man for his time and gas and possibly for lodging.

The City of Gillespie has donated 200 dollars to the improvement of our range so the training can be available at a closer to home location.


