The Committee approved routine end-of-year resolutions for Superintendent's salary from Motor Fuel Tax, 1984 Maintenance Funds for Motor Fuel Tax, and Special State and County Funds of \$1,200.00 each for W-15-D road.

A resolution to buy right-of-way in Macoupin County for a bridge on the Madison-Macoupin County line was approved.

MACOUPIN COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES

The regular meeting of the County Planning Commission was called to order by Earl Hagerman at 7:30 P. M. with ten regular and ex-officio members present. Welcome was given to the new member, Jack Alward, representing District 3, Shipman area. Guest was Beth Brase.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved

Tom Gazda had no subdivision activity, but introduced Beth Brase from the Macoupin County Health Department, who was developing a Private Sewage Ordinance. She outlined those areas related to our Subdivision Ordinance and requested comments from the Commission. In Section III the ordinance is the same as the Subdivision Ordinance in the minimum lot size for sewage disposal system. It was suggested that a clause allowing for a reduction in lot size should be added to allow for new technologies now available or in the future that would improve sewage disposal. The Subdivision Ordinance already has provided for variances that would fit this situation. In Section IV it was agreed that the Health Department should review sewage disposal plans on all subdivisions, but found it impractical to require soil absorption tests on each lot. The individual lot burden of proof should be on the home builder or sewage system contractor.

Earl Hagerman briefly reviewed the progress of the Farmland Preservation Ordinance Commission, noting that they are still preparing for township hearings this winter.

It was reported that Tom Langston has left the Regional Office and Mik Arnett is now director.

With no further business the meeting adjourned at 8:50 P. M.

Dear Mr. Jubelt:

From a reading of the minutes of the Macoupin County Board Meeting held November 15, 1983, it appears that \$7650.00 is to be paid to the State's Attorneys Appellate Commission out of the fund established by the legislature "to finance the Court system in the County."

We suggest for your consideration and for the consideration of the Macoupin County Board that the payment of \$7650.00 for the benefit of the State's Attorneys Office out of the Court Support Fund is not proper and should not take place..

The State's Attorneys Office is a part of the Executive branch of government. The fund "to finance the Court system in the County" should only be used for Judicial and Judicial related activities and purposes.



We suggest for your consideration and the consideration of the Macoupin County Board that the fund "to finance the Court system" could properly be used for Judicial expenses of Judges and Court staff members and expenses of the Clerk of the Court and Court Reporters and Bailiffs and to pay expenses of the Probation Department. Further we suggest that the Court Support Fund could be properly spent for Courtroom and Judicial office maintenance, construction and supplies. We have not mentioned all the uses to which the fund could be applied but in accordance with the law I believe you will agree with me that the fund should only be used "to finance the Court system in the county."

We will appreciate the County Board's consideration of the foregoing and the limiting of the uses of the Court Support Fund "to finance the Court system in the County."

Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

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COMMISSION TO STUDY COUNTY PROBLEMS  
NOTICE

Today, November 21, 1983, Attorney General Neil Hartigan issued an opinion regarding PA83-507 (HB 860) regarding the pick up of employee contributions to the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund.

It is the opinion of the Attorney General that PA83-507 authorizes counties and other participating municipalities to finance the pick up of employee contributions mandated by PA83-507 by using the same source of funds from which employee wages are paid with a corresponding (a) cash reduction in the salary of the individual employee, (b) offset against future earnings of the employee, or (c) combination of a cash reduction in salary and an offset against future earnings. What this means is that no new monies will be required for the payment of the picked up contributions which are mandated to begin July 1, 1984.

The purpose of the pick up of employee contributions required by PA83-507 is to take advantage of a tax deferral on retirement contributions to IMRF. The Internal Revenue Service has determined that pick up of the employees contributions to IMRF by the employer financed in the manner outlined above qualifies for tax deferral on such contributions. That is to say, that the employee will not pay taxes on the contributions made in this manner until the funds are withdrawn from the System.'

The County will be responsible for benefits and expenses due me. The line officer's \$400.00 monthly reimbursement will be increased to \$500.00 per month.



An audit of our case load will be completed with the help of State Probation staff to determine if our County needs additional probation officers. Caseload needs will be based on the number and type of cases we handle. The new officers will be funded 100% by the State. The County will provide equipment and office space for these officers.

Also for your information, Tom Ambrose, Probation Officer, has turned in his resignation effective January 1, 1984. He has accepted a position with Public Aid.
