Mr. Hutcheson briefed Committee on Greene County's Health Dept., which was passed by a resolution in 1967. Total Budget is \$485,000. Office has 26 employees, 19 full time with services delivered out into the homes. Presently have around 2400 sq. ft of office space. For every \$1.00 Greene County pays out they bring in \$10.00.

Mr. Grant stated that \$85,000 in grants would be available every year for a Health Dept. once the Dept. has been established. Probably would be two years before we would receive this.

County now provides \$15,240 to County Health Service Program - \$4694 for immunization clinics \$6,965 hypertension clinics, \$3,120 maternal and child health program and \$461 flu immunization for senior citizens.

County should check into what programs they would want to implement and look into sharing these various services with local hospital. Greene County has good working relationship with surrounding hospital. We are depriving citizens of Macoupin County of these services.

Al Grant, State Public Health Department representative, told the Board that when his Department was given responsibility of distributing block grant money for Public Health, there was no central agency to contact in Macoupin County. A Department could be established without any additional expenditure of funds. He stated the Department could operate on less than \$200,000.00. If in the future there were no funds available, the Board could eliminate the Department. State Funds could be received as soon as March 1.

Mary Lou Turcol, Home Health Administrator, Staunton Community Memorial Hospital, stated that home health care, women and infants' nutrition programs and hypertension screening are all self-supporting and would require no additional funding from the Board.

June Weise of the Tuberculosis Department stated the last 3 years there has been a gradual decrease in number of patients as active TB patients, due to the way treatment has changed. The caseload has decreased.

Mr. Gene St. Cin and Wayne Pederson from the Fred S. James Co., St. Louis, Mo., who are one of the top four brokers Firm in Country, spoke to Committee concerning County's present insurance coverages.

Taking a look at what we presently have, in order to be properly protected, we do not have enough liability coverage. County does not have enough coverage on contents, no liability coverage on evidence in Sheriff Dept., no coverage on contents at Highway Garage, no fidelity insurance. County does not have enough insurance, we have some loopholes in our insurance. Better to have a package insurance. Suggests we have buildings and contents appraised to make sure we are covered insurance wise. Will look into some type of health insurance regarding prisoners since Sheriff Dept. experiences so many health bills on prisoners.

Suggested alternatives - Leave insurance as is. Put together bid specifications. Appoint them as brokers and they will put together bid specifications, with a list of options, then put out for bids. Hire them as consultants.

In regards to employees health insurance. Explained a program for County which would be self funding. Take existing program we now have and come back to show how we can keep a control cost factor with present insurance. With 100 employees more than \$10,000 a month goes to pay hospital insurance. Program could be set up with a reserve account at a local bank, this \$10,000 going to bank, and whenever there is a loss, they would administer the claim, and draw against the bank. If one person should have a loss of \$50,000, with a stop loss cost, total loss over \$10,000., balance would be paid by insurance company. County would have some control over cost.

Committee to study this further before taking any action.

Notice was received from Washington National of a premium increase, 26% on a 12-month renewal basis, and 20% on a 6-month renewal basis.

Mr. Cerar stated Barney Arnett, executor for property next to jail, suggested that we hire an appraiser and the County hire an appraiser, and the two appraisers retain a third one, to appraise the peoperty, and we could go from there. It was suggested that Bertinetti Ins. would do this for County.

Motion made by Thomas Campbell, seconded by George Bray, that County have Bertinetti as appraiser for property next to jail. Roll Call: All yes. Motion carried.

As to storage space on third floor - it was suggested that metal shelving be used in place of wood because of fire hazard.

Committee discussed repairing wall in Board room. Suggested that wall be replastered, painted with moulding to keep chairs from marring walls or use paneling.

RESOLUTION

TO ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN A FULL-TIME HEALTH DEPARTMENT IN COMBINATION WITH TUBERCULOSIS SERVICES IN MACOUPIN COUNTY.

WHEREAS, Section 1 of "An Act in relation to the establishment and maintenance of county and multiple-county health departments," approved July 9, 1943, as amended, states that "Any county or two or more adjacent counties, may, by resolution of the county board or county boards of the respective counties, as the case may be, or upon approval by referendum as hereinafter provided, establish and maintain a full-time health department..."; and

WHEREAS, Macoupin County has a tuberculosis sanitarium and board established pursuant to "An Act relating to the care and treatment by counties of persons afflicted with tuberculosis and providing the means therefore," approved June 28, 1915, as amended; and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of this Board there is a need to establish and maintain a local health department and to combine these services with those of the tuberculosis sanitarium board;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the CountyBoard of Macoupin County, Illinois, that a health department is hereby established for the County of Macoupin, and that the Chairman of the County Board is instructed to appoint a Board of Health consisting of eight (8) members, in accordance with Section 13 of "An Act in relation to the establishment and maintenance of county and multiple-county health departments," approved July 9, 1943, as amended; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in accordance with Section 1a of "An Act relating to the care and treatment by counties of persons afflicted with tuberculosis and providing the means therefore," approved June 28, 1915, as amended,

- (1) The tuberculosis sanitarium and board are abolished and the employees, assets, and liabilities of the sanitarium and board transferred to and assumed by the Board of Health; and
- (2) A Tax imposed by the health department up to the maximum rate of .075, which shall not be increased at any time.

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RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the case load of the Macoupin County Probation Department has increased to the extent that it is necessary for one additional probation officer to be retained; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 34, Section 429.27, it is provided that a \$5.00 fee, pursuant to County resolution, may be collected on all violations of the Illinois Vehicle Code, with the proceeds to be used to finance the court system; and

WHEREAS, Macoupin County has passed said resolution collecting \$5.00 on all cases filed pursuant to the Illinois Vehicle Code.



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF MACOUPIN COUNTY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That one additional probation officer be retained for and employed by Macoupin County pursuant to Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 38, Section 204-1 et seq., and that said one additional probation officer shall be compensated pursuant to County Resolution Number 4 passed and approved by the MacoupinCountyBoard on August 10, 1982.

Section 2. That after the employment of the probation officer herein authorized, the Probation Department shall consist of the Chief Probation Officer, two Probation Officers and a secretary.

Section 3. That the County Treasurer, County Clerk, and Probation Department are hereby authorized to pay the salary, compensation, and expenses of the additional probation officer authorized by the CountyBoard, out of and from the \$5.00 fee collected in traffic cases pursuant to Section 429.27of Chapter 34 of the Illinois Revised Statutes and the Resolution of the CountyBoard authorizing said collection, and said Officers are authorized to expend funds for said purposes from the Traffic Violations Fees Account now maintained by the County Treasurer as the depository for said \$5.00 fee.

Mr. McDaniel explained the need for tax maps. With tax maps may be able to find property in County that is not being assessed. Could be beneficial to Highway Dept. and County Clerk Office. Tax maps needed to make use of the soil survey. Representative who was to be at meeting to quote prices was unable to attend. Committee is to visit Montgomery County and get a better understanding of tax map use. Committee to meet again at a later date with representative.

Presently there is \$150,000 to start on tax maps. McDaniel to check on other avenues for revenue for this program, which would take around two years to complete.

Mr. McDaniel asked Committee for permission to take Board of Review to IPA Seminar for Board of Review, February 28th, March 1st and 2nd, cost to be around \$300.

Mr. Bruce Harris of Sidwell Co., Chicago, IL., gave brief outline of company and presented a slide program to show how the tax maps are made and how they would benefit the County. They have mapped 77 Counties.

Aerial mapping which is done in Spring and Fall of year, accounts for every square inch in County. Trees need to be bare so usually there are twenty good days in year for photographing. Two scales of mapping - one for rural area and one for urban area. Negatives are enlarged five times.

Technical representatives would first have to gather information, and then would probably be nine months before first delivery or any billing. Representatives would work with all offices making use of these maps, to show how the maps are to be used. Along with the Assessors Office, County Clerk, Highway and Planning Commissions could make use of maps.

As you probably know, starting January 1st we became a Mobile In-Service Training Unit working directly under the Illinois Local Governmental Law Enforcement Officers State Training Board. We are sending you an updated agreement, to be approved by the board, to replace the old agreement which was under the Illinois Law Enforcement Commission.

As you know, the counties has in the past, put our office in their budget each year for local match funds. During FY 82 we did not need these funds to keep our office in operation, so we did not ask for them. We will be needing these funds this year.

Since we will be strictly a Mobile In-Service Training Unit, there was a need to change the formula for calculating these local match funds. The Executive Council, during their November 23, 1982 meeting, decided the only fair way of getting these funds was to charge so much per full time officer. The Council decided upon \$50.00 annually per full time officer. This will enable all of your officers, including part-time and auxiliary, to continue attending the In-Service Training classes, as they have in the past, at no additional cost.

We are requesting the agreement and the funds be mailed to our office by March 15th, if possible.

MACOUPIN COUNTY AGREEMENT TO ESTABLISH THE CONSTITUENT  
UNITS OF GOVERNMENT WITHIN THE  
WEST CENTRAL ILLINOIS CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL  
AS A "MOBILE TEAM IN-SERVICE TRAINING UNIT"

WHEREAS, the counties of Adams, Brown, Calhoun, Christian, Greene, Jersey, Pike, Macoupin, Montgomery and Schuyler together with the many municipalities contained therein, have for many years cooperated in local efforts to improve the law enforcement and criminal justice systems in said counties and municipalities through the West Central Illinois Training Program operated by the West Central Illinois Criminal Justice Council;

WHEREAS, through that association the aforesaid counties and municipalities have determined that there is a need to plan, coordinate and deliver training for the numerous public law enforcement agencies involved in said systems; and

WHEREAS, by means of the Intergovernmental Law Enforcement Officers In-Service Training Act (P.A. 82-674), the General Assembly and Governor of Illinois have determined that local efforts to achieve such planning and coordination for local law enforcement training should be expanded and strengthened through a program commonly known as the "Mobile Team In-Service Training Unit" and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Local Governmental Law Enforcement Officers Training Board has approved certain resolutions, regulations and guidelines to implement the aforesaid training program in Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The County of Macoupin has determined that the aforesaid training program is one which would benefit said county, as well as the various other counties and municipalities within the West Central Illinois Criminal Justice Training Region:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, pursuant to Article 7, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution of 1970 and the provisions of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, and otherwise:

(1) The County of Macoupin hereby authorizes the West Central Illinois Criminal Justice Council to establish and maintain a "Local Training Advisory Board" as defined in the Intergovernmental Law Enforcement Officers In-Service Training Act, and agrees to cooperate through the Board so that it may fulfill the duties imposed upon such boards by state law and regulations.

(2) The County of Macoupin hereby agrees, with the West Central Illinois Criminal Justice Council and each other participating unit of government within said Training Region, to cooperatively promote improvements in the law enforcement training services within said Region, and particularly those which transcend the departments, agencies or geographical boundaries of any single such unit, all as more fully set out in the bylaws of the Commission and operation procedures governing the Training Region.

(3) The County of Macoupin hereby authorizes the West Central Illinois Criminal Justice Council to provide to the constituent governments those training services and activities permitted by the Act which are beneficial and in the best interest of the local governments participating in the training program.

(4) The County of Macoupin hereby authorizes the West Central Illinois Criminal Justice Council to apply for, receive, utilize and expend state or other such funds as might be available to it to assist it in performing the foregoing services and activities, all in accordance with applicable law.

(5) The County of Macoupin hereby agrees to participate financially to support the programs and services of the law enforcement Training Region as conducted by the West Central Illinois Criminal Justice Council and the Local Training Advisory Board. It is understood that participation in the programs and services of the Training Region is met through the county's and municipalities financial contribution, except for such costs which may be necessary to conduct certain special programs or services that may be requested.




