Dr. Heinz reported on reimbursement to County by special programs offered during 83-84 school year for administrative services and indirect costs.

Dr. Heinz received an Alternative School proposal. This program was designed to assist high school drop-outs, between the ages of 16-21, to receive their G.E.D. certificates and review pre-employment skills. The Regional Superintendent's Office received a \$46,500 grant to conduct the Alternative Education program. Illinois Valley will supply \$40,000, Dept. of Adult Vocational Technical Education will supply \$5,000. and Career Guidance will supply \$1,500.

Committee viewed some basement rooms of the Carlinville Post Office. Part of this area is the potential site of the Alternative School. The Alternative School and the office of ESDA plan to occupy the space in the very near future.

Request was made to remove the overgrown worm infested shrubbery surrounding the Regional Supt. of School Office. This would help ease the parking problem and also rid the premises of an overabundance of bag worms. Meeting adjourned at 11:15 AM.


