REPORT OF ROAD AND BRIDGE COMMITTEE FOR MONDAY, JUNE 8, 1987 BOARD MEETING

The County rejected the first bids on the Bunker Hill road, has redone the plans, and has asked the State to re-let on June 26th. The Committee approved a resolution between the County and Bird Township for sharing costs on engineering for a new bridge at Charity Church. The Committee approved an agreement with MCI for a permit to run fiber optic line along the ICG Railroad. The Committee as guests of Capital Machinery Company visited the casting plant and equipment testing grounds in Peoria. The timber bridge on the west side of Eagarville is failing. The County is obligated for 50% of costs for repair or replacement. Work is proceeding on the new Nilwood bridge. A reletting for cold patch was held with low bids going to Lippold & Arnett and Charles Mahoney Company. Jean Davis started work today as a secretary in the Highway Department.

REPORT OF M & M MATERIALS FOR MEETING HELD ON JUNE 1, 1987

The meeting was called to order at 11:00 A.M., on Monday, June 1, 1987 at the Ariston Restaurant in Litchfield by President George Caveny. Present from Montgomery County were Ken German, Paul Hamrock, Mary Hughes, Walter Webb and Arthur J. Loebach. A sign off on this letter will indicate your agreement to comply with the Corridor grant as a sub-grantee and allow WIU to process a check for the DCCA match portion of your local project.

3. By June 30, 1987

All funds (DCCA and local) must be firmly committed or already expended -- purchase orders prepared, contracts for labor, materials, or other project costs signed, etc.

4. By August 17, 1987

All funds (DCCA and local) must be expended and a brief project report must be submitted. The report should include the following:

- a) A brief description of project results
- b) A copy of any completed project (that is reasonable) -- brochure that was projected, a photo, news clippings, etc.
- c) A signed "CERTIFICATION OF PROJECT COMPLETION" -- blank copy enclosed
- d) Photo copies of bills, contracts, cancelled checks, etc., that document local and grant expenditures.

Some miscellaneous points that you should keep in mind on your local projects are:

- 1. Keep good records of expenditures of both local funds and grant funds.
- 2. Printed materials such as brochures, etc., must have the "Build Illinois" logo and the wording "In Cooperation with the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs, Corridors of Opportunity Program."
- 3. If, for some reason, you do not spend the DCCA match funds on your local project, you must anticipate having to return those funds to the state.
- 4. If your local project is going to cost significantly less than you initially anticipated, contact the appropriate Corridor Co-administrator for details on how to proceed.

RE: Multi-State Lottery Revenue Sharing.

Two State Representatives, Sam Panavotovich and Anthony Young, have proposed that local governments share in the estimated \$60 million a year in new state revenues that are expected to be generated as part of the new multi-state lottery. This money will be in addition to the more than \$800 million now generated by the lottery.

The Panavotovich-Young proposal calls for the common school fund and local governments to each receive a 50 percent share of those funds, or approximately \$30 million to local governments statewide. The funds for municipalities and counties will be allocated through the local government distribution fund.

This proposal is one of several advanced for dividing the multi-state lottery funds. With the many demands on small towns, cities and counties for additional revenues to fund services, this proposal could possibly assist in solving some of your financial problems.

Attached is a table listing the amount of revenue each county and any city of 40,000 or more residents would receive based on the local government distributive fund formula.

If you support the Panavotovich-Young proposal for local governments to share revenue from the Multi-State Lottery, please contact your local State Representatives and ask for their support. This issue will come before the House next week, June 8 through the 12th. Therefore, you must contact these legislators in the next few days to cite your position on this proposal.

Dear County Board Chairman:

On November 6, 1986, President Reagan signed the Immigration Reform and Control Act which will affect all American employers--public and private alike.

The law prohibits employers from knowingly hiring illegal aliens, but does not affect employees hired prior to its enactment. At the same time, it provides those illegal aliens who have lived continuously in this country before 1982 with an opportunity to obtain legal status.

In addition, the law prohibits discrimination on the basis of citizenship or national origin. For example, you could be fined for firing employees because of their "foreign" name, appearance or language. For the first time, it also requires individuals hired by either the public or private sector to present proof of citizenship when applying for jobs and sets out criminal penalties and civil sanctions for violations.

To give the public a chance to become familiar with the new requirements, there is a grace period until May 31, 1987, during which the federal government will not penalize employers who fail to comply with the new law. When the grace period ends June 1, 1987, there will be a twelve month period during which employers will receive only a warning or citation for a first offense. Additional offenses during this warning period will be subject to full penalties. At the end of the warning period (June 1, 1988), the penalty provisions will be in full force.

Attached is a pamphlet which contains an analysis of the most recent information available concerning the Immigration Reform and Control Act. The pamphlet also contains a copy of the proposed Employment Eligibility Verification form (Form I-9) on page 7 that will be required by employers. Final copies of the I-9 form will be available in late May. Dear Producer:

We want to remind you that operators on all farms need to report crops planted by June 19th. This is the final date to report - after this date there will be a late-filed fee. When reporting your acreage you need to: 1. have the crops planted; 2. the set-aside seeded into an acceptable cover crop; 3. have accurate measurements of split fields. I encourage you to report as soon as you are able since we have many farm reports to take and the time is shorter than in previous years. When reporting crops you certify that the program crops are within the permitted acreage and the setaside is as required. After certifications are made, we spot check farms. If an incorrect report is found, it will result in a loss of program benefits.

If you have wheat planted, it would be advisable to report this acreage well before harvest time.

No hay or seed may be harvested from set-aside acres. Grazing is permitted beginning August 1st. No grazing is permitted from March 1 thru July 31. Weeds shall be controlled - if not a penalty shall be assessed.

June 1st is the final date to get a 1986 corn loan. As you may know, CCC is out of funds and until Congress appropriates additional funds we cannot disburse any checks. We can although issue certificates. If you have a question regarding loans before the end of the month, please call our office.

The Illinois Heritage Association invites you to review the enclosed materials explaining a proposal for Macoupin County's participation in a program to encourage the preservation of county and state heritage. We have developed this project with the advice and encouragement of the Champaign County Board.

This spring, the IHA staff met with the Policy Committee of the Champaign County Board, which unanimously recommended membership in the IHA as an item in its next fiscal budget. Your county might choose to fund its participation in the program in this way, or by any other appropriate means. Membership fees are based on county population and have been set at the lowest possible rate, with the intent of gaining maximum participation by county boards throughout the state. This membership fee is the only cost required for you to take part. The benefits are many.

To establish communication among Macoupin County, the IHA, and other counties in Illinois, it is important to appoint a liaison person from your county board. We recommend that your county board chairman or another board member with an interest in the history and heritage of your county be selected.

Several county boards whose representatives attended the April Urban Counties Council meeting in Peoria, where preliminary information about this program was distributed, have expressed interest in it. We hope that Macoupin County will join these counties by designating a liaison person and taking out a membership in the Illinois Heritage Association as soon as possible. An invoice is enclosed for your convenience. If you have any questions, please contact the staff at our office. We look forward to a long and beneficial association with the Macoupin County Board in our joint efforts to preserve the local heritage of counties throughout Illinois. It would be helpful if you could indicate to us when we might expect to hear of your board's action regarding this proposal.

AGREEMENT AND RESOLUTION
(PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING)

This agreement and resolution entered into this 8th day of June, 1987, by and between the County of Macoupin, State of Illinois, acting through its County Board hereinafter called the COUNTY and BIRD Road District, Macoupin County, Illinois hereinafter called the ROAD DISTRICT, acting through its Highway Commissioner,

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has entered into an agreement with the STATE using Township Bridge Program Funds and Local Agency Funds to engineer and construct the following project:

Replace Existing Bridge No. 059-3124
BIRD Road District
Section 87-02109-00-BR Over Bear Creek
Located Near the N.E. Corner, Section 14, T. 10 N., R. 8 W., of 3rd P.M. and,

WHEREAS, the TBP funds may be used to pay 80% of Preliminary Engineering of this ROAD DISTRICT project and said total preliminary engineering cost is estimated at \$15,000.00,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. That the County shall enter into an "Agreement for Preliminary Engineering Service" (Design Engineering) with OZYURT ENGINEERS, INC. SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS for this project and that actual cost funds shall be obligated as of the date of the agreement and shall be shared as follows:
80% State TBP Funds
10% County Bridge Funds
10% Road District Funds
2. That any preliminary engineering costs not covered by TBP funds shall be shared on a 50-50 basis between the COUNTY and ROAD DISTRICT.
3. That the ROAD DISTRICT does hereby resolve that there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$2,000.00 or as much as necessary thereof to pay its share of the preliminary engineering costs. ROAD DISTRICT funds are appropriated in whole or in part from Motor Fuel Tax, Special Bridge, Road and Bridge or other legally spendable funds.
4. That the COUNTY does hereby resolve that there is hereby appropriated \$2,000.00 from the "County Bridge Fund" or as much as necessary thereof to pay its share of the preliminary engineering costs and \$15,000.00 from the TBP funds to pay for 80% of the preliminary engineering costs.

This AGREEMENT and RESOLUTION shall be binding and inure to the benefit of the parties their successors and assigns.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the COUNTY and ROAD DISTRICT hereby agree to pass a Supplemental Resolution to provide necessary funds for their share of the cost if the amount appropriated herein proves to be insufficient to cover said costs.

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RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, MCI Telecommunications Corporation, 1133 19th Street Northwest, Washington, D.C. 20036, has requested permission and authority to construct, operate and maintain communication lines (fiber optic lines) over, under, along and across all County Highways in Macoupin County, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of the County of Macoupin, pursuant to Section 9-113 of the Illinois Highway Code, as amended, and Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 134, Section 4 (1983), has authority to grant such permission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Macoupin County Board hereinafter termed the County that permission and authority be, and is hereby granted to MCI Telecommunications Corporation, hereinafter termed the OWNER, its successors and assigns, to construct, operate and maintain communication lines over, under, along and across all County Highways in Macoupin County, Illinois, for a term of twenty years, expiring May 31, 2007, to be renewed subject to review.

This permission and authority and permit is granted subject to the following limitations and conditions:

A. Except as otherwise noted, or not applicable, for the purpose of this resolution, where the term "County" is used, it shall also in addition include "Road District" and where the term "County Superintendent of Highways" is used, it shall also in addition include "Township Highway Commissioner."

1.) Permit requests for each project shall be sent to the County Superintendent of Highways (only) and shall include a drawing and permit (Exhibit A) from the OWNER showing the size, type, location, nature and extent of utility company facilities being located within or along highway right-of-way. The drawing shall also include the existing and/or proposed location of the utility company facilities within or along the highway right-of-way with respect to any planned highway improvement or existing highway, and show right-of-way lines. The County Superintendent of Highways (only) shall approve and sign permits involving county highways; he shall obtain the approval and signature of the Township Highway Commissioner for road district roads in addition to his own approval and signature.

2.) Upon completion of any work, the Superintendent of Highways (only) shall be given written notification and, if completed in a satisfactory manner, he shall give the OWNER a letter of acceptance. This letter of acceptance shall in no way relieve the OWNER of his responsibility under this Resolution.

3.) The OWNER shall indemnify and save harmless the County and County Superintendent of Highways against all claims, expenses, loss and liability on account of injury or death of persons or damage to property caused by or arising out of construction, existence, maintenance or operation of said communication lines under this Resolution or the exercise of any other rights hereby granted. OWNER shall maintain in effect at all times, public liability insurance with limits of not less than \$200,000 per person and \$1,000,000 per accident, for any such injury or death of persons and \$50,000 for any such damage to property; and OWNER shall furnish County and County Superintendent of Highways on request at any time, Certificates of such Insurance by OWNER'S insurer.

- 4.) That the OWNER, upon written request of County Superintendent of Highways, will relocate, and rearrange or encase any of said communication lines when such becomes necessary in the construction, maintenance or improvement of said highways. The entire cost of such adjustment to be borne by the OWNER unless otherwise provided by law.
- 5.) That the County or County Superintendent of Highways will not be held for any damage or liabilities whatsoever to said communication lines (fiber optic line) caused by the construction, maintenance or relocation of said highways.
- 6.) That, in case of damage to the existing highway during the construction or maintenance of said communication lines, the OWNER shall repair said damage within ten days, climatic conditions permitting. If, at the end of ten days, said damage to the highway is not repaired in a satisfactory manner, and the delay is not caused by climatic conditions, the COUNTY may repair said damage and the actual cost of such repair, including the cost of all material and labor, shall be paid to the County by the OWNER upon receipt of an itemized statement of costs.
- 7.) That the OWNER shall deposit with the County Clerk a good and sufficient bond in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) signed by the proper officials of the Company, as surety that the conditions herein set forth are complied with in full. However, it is understood the OWNER'S LIABILITY UNDER THE SAID CONDITIONS IS NOT LIMITED TO THE AMOUNT OF SAID BOND.
- 8.) OWNER, shall send a letter at the time it files said Bond with the County Clerk of Macoupin County, acknowledging its obligations under the said conditions and that its liability is not limited to the amount of said bond.
- 9.) The OWNER shall take all necessary precautions by use of signs, signals, flagmen, or watchmen to protect the general public and all reasonable measures to cause least interference with traffic movement along the highway where construction or maintenance is in progress. All traffic control shall be accordance with the current State of Illinois "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices" and amendments thereof.
- 10.) OWNER shall indemnify the County and County Superintendent of Highways from all liability for interference with or damage to, in any manner, other utilities located in, along, under, or upon said highways which may result from OWNER'S work undertaken pursuant to this Resolution.
- 11.) This Resolution is issued for the OWNER with the understanding that any damage to property abutting said County Highways caused by construction, operation, or maintenance of said utility facilities shall be promptly repaired to original condition and/or paid for if necessary.
- 12.) If any drain tile is encountered, the County Superintendent of Highways shall be notified thereof in writing, and such drain tile shall be restored and replaced at its original elevation.
- 13.) Upon completion of construction, the grade of any roadway ditch shall be restored as closely as practicable, to its present condition. Culverts and tiles shall be restored as closely as practical to their present condition.
- 14.) Except for a possible extraordinary circumstance, all installations under any pavement of concrete, brick, built up asphalt or bituminously treated surface shall be made by boring.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the OWNER for and in consideration of nominal fee of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), fee to compensate cost to the County (only) for issuing Utility permits, forward this amount of compensation to the "Treasurer of Macoupin County-Highway Fund" for permission and authority herein granted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the permission and authority herein granted is limited to the jurisdiction the COUNTY may have over said highways, and does not presume to release the OWNER from fulfilling any and all statutes relating to the construction, operation or maintenance of said communication lines or statutes relating to the right of owners of abutting property along said highways.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Clerk be and is hereby instructed to issue two (2) certified copies of this Resolution to the OWNER, in care of Brown Engineering Company, 2407 Washington Road, Washington, Illinois, 61571 upon receipt of the above mentioned Bond, Letter and consideration.

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Section 39s-1-12, Chapter 48, Illinois Revised Statutes, 1973, and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the County Board of Macoupin County investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of said County employed in performing construction of public works, for said County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRMAN AND BOARD OF Macoupin County:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the County, is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in Macoupin County as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June 1987 a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction of the County to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The County Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this County, this determination of such prevailing rate of wage.

SECTION 4: The County Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addressed, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The County Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: The County Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a copy of this Ordinance, and such publication shall constitute notice that the determination is effective and that this is the determination of this public body.
