Rick and Amy Rosentreter requested an easement twenty feet (20') in width for the construction, repair and maintenance of a waterline. The Committee unanimously agreed to charge Rick and Amy Rosentreter \$300.00 to pay for this Committee meeting. Since County Clerk Zippay has agreed to waiver the Recording Fee, the \$300.00 check is to be deposited into the County General Fund. The Committee discussed the request for the easement, and the following motion was made:

<u>MOTION</u>: Motion was made by Zirkelbach, seconded by Long, to approve the easement, to Rick and Amy Rosentreter, for a waterline across the County-owned farm ground North of the County Highway Department building. All in favor, <u>Motion Carried</u>.

EASEMENT FOR WATER LINE

- 1. Grantor owns the following described real estate:

 The Southwest Quarter (SW ¼) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of
 Section Sixteen (16), Township Ten (10) North, Range Seven (7) West of
 the Third Principal Meridian, Macoupin County, Illinois.
- 2. Grantee owns the following described real estate:

 A ten (10) acre parcel more or less along the South Line of the Northwest Quarter (NW ¼) of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Sixteen (16), Township Ten (10) North, Range Seven (7) West of the Third Principal Meridian, Macoupin County, Illinois.
- 3. There is presently located upon the real estate described above as owned by the Grantor a public water line, presently located in reasonable proximity to the County Highway Department building located on such real estate. Grantor and Grantee have agreed that said public waterline may be attached onto by the Grantee and extended at Grantee's costs for the purposes of transmission of water onto the above described property owned by Grantee.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the sum of TEN AND MORE (\$10.00) DOLLARS and other good and valuable consideration paid by Grantee, the

adequacy and receipt of which are hereby acknowledged by Grantor, the Grantor hereby grants unto Grantee, their personal representative, heirs, devisees, assigns, and successors in interest, an easement twenty feet (20 ') in width for the construction, repair and maintenance of a waterline from the existing waterline on the property owned by Grantor below and across such lands owned by Grantor, along the west side of the subject premises and parallel to the existing Illinois State Route 4, a distance of several hundred feet from the existing waterline to the south side of the real estate owned by Grantee. Grantee agrees to bear the costs of the repair and maintenance of the waterline to be installed along this easement upon the land of Grantor, and to compensate or otherwise repair the lands of Grantor, and for any reasonable damages sustained by Grantor during the installation or maintenance of such waterline.

This easement shall include a right of ingress and egress to Grantee regarding the construction, installation, and reasonable maintenance of the above described waterline.

This easement shall be perpetual, shall constitute a covenant running with the lands, and shall be binding and obligatory upon the parties, personal representative, heirs, devisees, assigns and successors in interest of each of the parties.



REPORT OF ROAD & BRIDGE COMMITTEE MEETING - MAY 4, 2010

PRESENT: Goodman, Nichelson, Novak, Pomatto, Schwallenstecker, Vojas, Wieseman, and Reinhart

PURPOSE OF THE MEETING: Audit April claims and other business.

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m..

Claims 6981 through 7011 totaling \$ 94,554.80 were read and approved.

PETITIONS:

The following 50/50 project petitions were presented:

Scottville #36	\$ 4,000.00	\$ 2,000.00

Western Mound #29	2,500.00	1,250.00

The County's obligation for each project will be the "County Share" only.

MOTION: Made by Pomatto, seconded by Vojas to approve the petitions and recommend passage by the full board. All in favor. Motion Carried.

APPROVED AND RECOMMENDED:

The Committee discussed repairs to the Shipman Cutoff Road. Through the efforts of Senator Demuzio this project has received \$ 195,000 in Emergency Repair Program Funds. The Committee recommended that Reinhart contact the Chairman Manar about pursuing additional funds available from the Illinois Department of Transportation. The Committee also reviewed a preliminary engineering agreement for the design and preparation of plans for the improvements and the following motion was made:

MOTION: Made by Wieseman, seconded by Nichelson to recommend to the full Board the approval of the preliminary engineering agreement with Cummins Engineering Corporation, Springfield for the design and preparation of plans for improvements to Shipman Cutoff Road (C.H. 57) in an amount not to exceed \$24,725 (Section 10-00068-02-FP). All in favor. Motion Carried.

A preliminary engineering agreement for the design of the railroad crossing approaches on Wolf Road in Mt. Olive Twp was considered. This project is 100% financed with Grade Crossing Protection Funds from the Illinois Commerce Commission. The following motion was made:

MOTION: Made by Novak, seconded by Vojas to recommend to the full Board the approval of the preliminary engineering agreement with Hutson & Associates, Inc., Bunker Hill for the design of the Wolf Road railroad crossing approaches in an amount not to exceed \$ 11,590 (Section 10-14900-00-RR). All in favor. Motion Carried.

DISCUSSION:

Reinhart informed the Committee of a lawsuit that has been filed against the County by Donald and Karrie Stahl of Brighton.

The Committee also discussed the condition of the Emmerson Airline. The road suffered serious damage during the spring thaw due to saturated subgrade conditions. Reinhart said the distressed areas have been repaired but they will require further attention this summer.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 a.m.
