Note1: Certain balance figures may be slightly different due to not re-amortizing balances every month after an extra payment toward principal. Actual balances will be determined prior to final collection if necessary in any instance. Listed principal balances reflect amortization schedules.

Note2: As of the date of this report (1/31/2012), Connexus had entered into a verbal agreement with the State's Attorney's Office concerning repayment of outstanding debt to the Revolving Loan Fund. The current principal balance is an estimate based on principal being paid for due payments on 10/1/11 and 11/1/11 with remaining balance from two payments (1/10/12 and 1/31/12) going to interest and required late fees. Future payments will go toward fulfilling all required late fees, interest due, and principal until Connexus is current with 3/1/12 due payment.

Note3: A \$10,000.00 loan at 3% interest / one-pay note to the Mercantile Center (formerly listed with a separate, current loan under R&A Enterprises) was approved by the County Board at its December 2011 meeting. Per terms of the note, the Mercantile Center is required to appear before the County Board's Economic Development Committee to provide appropriate financial updates and foreclosures in the event the loan has not yet been prepaid. Repayment of the single-pay note is due no later than January 1, 2013.

Note1: With the Illinois Family Farms, LLC lease effective 3/1/09 – 2/29/12, payment due dates are not specifically spelled out; however, from the continuation of a prior lease, payments were expected on a 3/1 and 11/1 due schedule. Also, the lease provided for 26 acres at \$280 per acre. Final payment received in 2011 cleared up all net payments due to the County, leaving Illinois Family Farms current on conclusion of this 3-year lease (the acreage farmed was reduced due to selling land to Poggenpohl Redi-Mix in year 3; also ILFF remitted payment for the 26th acre in years 1 and 2; a separate sheet detailing a full cost accounting is available in the County Board office).

Note2: County records indicate that on 10/17/2008, CISCO Steel made a payment of \$10,400 for the 1/30/2008 due payment as well as the preceding 3 years which had lapsed. A payment of \$7,800 was made on 1/31/2011 for payment due 1/30/2011 as well as the preceding 2 years which had lapsed. As of the payment due 1/30/2012, an invoice was sent by the CFO to CISCO Steel in early January and payment was received on 1/18/2012.

Note2: Following the missed payment from the Macoupin County Fair & Agricultural Association, Inc. due on 1/1/2012, the CFO sent correspondence notifying the association of the lack of payment.

Shop BenGil revealed to local business owners




TJ Allan, co-founder of Shop BenGil, explains to business owners it is all about convenience.

Bunker Hill Awarded \$270,000 CDAP Infrastrucure Funds

SPRINGFIELD – January 18, 2012. It was announced today nearly \$19 million in federal funding to address the infrastructure needs of 59 small and rural communities throughout Illinois. Awarded through the Community Development Assistance Program (CDAP), the funding will be used to make improvements to water and sewer lines, including replacing water mains, upgrading storm water systems and repairing sewer lines.

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Op-

portunity (DCEO) administrers Illinois' CDAP program, which is known nationally as the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program and provides federal funding for a variety of community-based projects. Communities with populations of 50,000 or less can apply for CDAP grant funding to support a variety of projects.



Dear Mr. Manar:

This letter is being sent in an attempt to communicate a concern I have regarding the road surface condition on Fosterburg Road. Please be aware I do not expect miracles, nor do I expect immediate action. I simply want to convey what I know to all of you as we start a new year and a new budget so that together we can work toward a solution before another serious accident occurs.

Following find an account of "known" vehicle accidents that have occurred on Fosterburg Road from Terpening Road going south ½ of a mile in the year 2011. As Mr. Long has already conveyed to you, there have been several accidents in the "curved" area of Fosterburg Road near his home which are not included in this list. In addition to the list below, there were indeed additional vehicles that lost control in this ½ mile section, some causing personal damage to property, some did not, but we simply failed to record them when they occurred.

I'm sure you are also aware some years back this same condition existed. The surface of the road at that time lost its "texture" for lack of a better word, and when it became "damp," no heavy rain was required, it became very slick. The surface at that time was completely redone and the incident rate decreased dramatically. Speed is indeed a factor, and the additional heavy truck traffic is a factor, but the road surface is once again in need of attention. At this time, although I applaud the repair efforts that have been made to date, there appears to be a condition where some vehicles lose traction while traveling this stretch of pavement thus contributing to some drivers no longer being able to control their vehicle.

2011

A 7 passenger carry-all (with 11 boys in it, in spite of what The Telegraph reported) with high school boys turned over on the west side of the road, about 100 yds south of Leo Strohbeck's house. One went to hospital for check up, but was released. Happened in the spring but date not recorded.

During the night of 22 April, someone lost control and hit the fence on the east side of the road. Location was half way between Leo's house and Titchenal Road. Tore out @ 150 feet of fence.

An older gentleman lost control of his vehicle and hit the fence in April as well. Tore out @ 100 feet of fence in this area.

A lady lost control of her car in April as well, hit the fence in the same area between Leo's house and Tichenal Road.

Mr. Denby from Carlinville lost control and hit the fence, same area on 14 May, roughly 100 feet of fence to repair.

Mr. Rife from Gillespie turned his truck over and hit the fence, east side, same area south of Leo's house.

A pick-up truck lost control just north of Leo's house and tore up the road bank, but missed the fence on 26 Nov.

Someone lost control and hit the fence just north of the house on 4 Dec, tore out @ 150 feet of fence and left.

A young man, David Freer, founder of Freer Auto Body in Alton, lost his life when his truck overturned in this exact same area in September of 2008. Let's do something before this same tragedy repeats itself.

In closing, I want to thank you for your service to our county and for taking the time to listen to my concern, it is indeed appreciated. I have had the opportunity to work with the public a great deal during my lifetime and I truly understand the challenges that can and often do develop. I am a resident of the county and I am "almost" the last house in Macoupin County as my driveway is accessed via Thompson Lane which has the Madison/Macoupin County line going down the middle of it.
