Bunker Hill Cemetery Board

Board Composition:	The District board is composed of six (6) trustees appointed by the Macoupin County Board Chairman with the advice and consent of the County Board.
Origin of Entity:	The District was established in accordance with the Cemetery Maintenance District Act (70 ILCS 105/1).
Property Tax/Funding:	The district receives contributions, gifts, bequests, or devise of any property whatsoever.

Bunker Hill Fire Protection District

Origin of Entity:	The District was established in accordance with the Fire Protection District Act (70 ILCS 705/4).
Property Tax/Funding:	The District levies an annual property tax to fund its fire services, but also receives a state replacement tax and interest income.

Fosterburg Water District

Service Description:	The district oversees the production and distribuion of potable water.
Board Composition:	The District board is composed of seven (7) trustees, one (1) of which is appointed by the Macoupin County Board Chairman with the advice and consent of the County Board.
Origin of Entity:	The District was established in accordance with the Public Water District Act (70 ILCS 705/4).
Property Tax/Funding:	The District receives funding from user fees.

Girard Fire Protection District

Board Composition:	The IVEDC Governing Board has tri-part representation by 24 members from the four (4) county service area. These members serve a two-year renewable term and they represent local government, private groups/interests and individuals who have received agency services. The Macoupin County Board appoints two (2) members to the Board.

Service Description:	The Board of Health ensures that all state laws and County Ordinances regarding the preservation of health are upheld through observation and enforcement.
Board Composition:	The Authority board consists of eight (8) commissioners appointed by the Macoupin County Board Chairman with the advice and consent of the County Board.
Origin of Entity:	The Public Health department was created in 1983 through a Macoupin County Board resolution consolidating previous public health services.
Property Tax/Funding:	The Health Department receives its funding from a designated property tax as well as other federal, state and local sources, including charges for services and grants.

Macoupin County Emergency Telephone System Board

Location:	215 S. East St, Suite 2, Carlinville, IL 62626
Service Description:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Overseeing the planning and maintaining of the county 9-1-1 system; • Receiving and accounting for moneys from the landline and wireless surcharge for the deposit into the emergency telephone system fund; • Coordinating and supervising the implementation, upgrading of the system, including but not limited to the need and required equipment; • Establishing of address and maintaining the Master Street Address Guide (MSAG) • Assuring the data base for automatic number identification (ANI) and automatic location identification (ALI) equipment, a computer aided dispatch system that records, maintains and integrates information, maintaining an enhanced mapping system, all to increase the operational efficiency of emergency services; • Maintaining the street or road signs of non-incorporated areas that are essential to the implementation and every day need by emergency responders; • Other products and services necessary for the overall implementation, maintenance or upgrade of the system and any other purpose related to the operation of the system, including everyday costs attributed to the 9-1-1 system.

Otter Lake Water Commission

Service Description:	The Otter Lake Water Commission is currently constructing a new High Service Pump Building using the IEPA Revolving Funds Loan Program. The \$1,808,500 project includes 3 high service pumps and motors, 2 backwash pumps and motors, and VFD drives. Our projection in annual electric savings is over \$35,000 per year. Some of the equipment being replaced was originally installed in 1969, when the water plant was built. This project will reduce electric cost while improving reliability of our water supply. The Otter Lake Water Commission serves water to Auburn, Divernon, Girard, Pawnee, Thayer, Virden, Nilwood, and Tovey; as well as, Henderson and South Palmyra Rural Water Districts.

West Central Regional Planning Commission
