MINUTES

Motion by Harding, seconded by Campbell, to approve the minutes of the May 9, 2006 meeting. All in favor, motion carried.

GUESTS

Kent Tarro, Public Health Department, advised of an increase in oral cancer in people over 40, especially males. Everyone should visit the dentist and their physician twice a year to have a thorough evaluation.

Tarro thanked the Board and advised over 300 seniors were served at the Senior Health Fairs throughout Macoupin County in the last two months. Board member Wieseman stated he and his wife attended the Health Fair in Brighton and they were both impressed by Tarro's staff.

Tarro makes every effort to work with other agencies in Macoupin County and opened a medical clinic in Gillespie five years ago. He is working on a grant from the State of Illinois so that psychiatric care could also be offered at the Gillespie facility. This service would reduce hospital stays, pharmacy costs and also reduce medical services. Residents, who have mental deficiencies, do not always get the medical care they need.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Pratt read the minutes of the May 22, 2006, **Legislation & Technology Committee** meeting. Shaun Blobam, representative of Bruce Harrison and Associates gave an in-depth visual presentation on the progress of Bulletin 810 dealing with new guidelines for the assessment of farmland in the State of Illinois. Nora Feuquay, Economic Development Coordinator, brought the Committee up-to-date on the needs of the new County Website. Feuquay will meet again with Officials/Department Heads to collect the necessary information for the Website. Motion by Pratt, seconded by Bacon, to approve the minutes as presented. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion by Zippay, seconded by Wiggins, to seat Fraser and change the count to 26 present and one absent. All in favor, motion carried.

Watson read the minutes of the May 23, 2006, **Economic Development Committee** meeting. Nora brought the Committee up-to-date on several topics. Expansion of the Enterprise Zone to include Gillespie Eye Care's new building has been submitted for approval. Revolving Loan Fund accounts are all current except for one which has been turned over to the States Attorney's Office due to delinquency. The Committee requested an Annual Report of the Revolving Loan Fund. The Website was also discussed again. Committee members were very appreciative of the informative report. Motion by Watson, seconded by Coatney, to approve minutes as reported. All in favor, motion carried.

Goodman read the minutes of the June 6, 2006, **Road and Bridge Committee** meeting. Claims were approved for payment. The third amendment to the November 1999 subsidence agreement with Exxon Mobil Coal USA was tabled and the second amendment was recommended for approval to the Board in addition to a Preliminary Engineering Agreement with Coombe-Bloxdorf of Springfield, Illinois for reconstruction of Litchfield Road from Route #4 to Cottonwood Road. The status of the April 20, 2006 County and Township Oil letting was discussed. Motion by Goodman, seconded by Thomas, to approve the minutes as written. All in favor, motion carried.

REPORTS OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE

Chairman Manar said the Health Insurance Committee is moving forward as they did last year. The Committee will be looking for a health insurance provider and also a broker. Manar stated the Board is considering administering the HRA account next year to save money and possibly make up for the increase in co-pay for employees this year. Manar and Dowland will prepare a list of questions for prospective insurance providers to answer so that pertinent questions will be uniform and easier to understand. Motion by Lux, seconded by Pratt, to approve minutes as written. All in favor, motion carried.
