**MINUTES**

Motion by Herschelman, seconded by Long, to approve the minutes of the January 29, 2009, meeting. All in favor, motion carried.

**GUESTS**

Kent Tarro, Administrator, Macoupin County Public Health Department, advised the Board Members that Senior Spring Expos will be held on Friday, March 20 at the Ss. Mary and Joseph Church in Carlinville and on Tuesday, April 21 at the Crystal Ballroom in Staunton. Tarro informed the Board that he received a letter from the State to stop the radon screenings as the Federal Government will not be sending money to the State.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

The **Animal Control Committee** met on February 2, 2009. The Committee met to discuss and make recommendations regarding the Animal Control Building/Shelter and other business. Novak advised the Committee that a person who was to appear in court on animal abuse charges did not show and the Judge may opt to forfeit the Bond money to the Animal Control Department. Discussion was held regarding the Animal Control Building and Shelter as to the decisions that need to be made before construction begins. Animal Control Administrator Bertagnolli distributed the monthly activity report for review. Motion by Novak, seconded by Harding to approve the minutes

with the correction “if the Bond is forfeited it will go to the Animal Control Fund. All in favor, motion carried.

The **Planning and Subdivision Committee** met on February 2, 2009. Robert Duvall from Patrick Engineering in Springfield gave a presentation regarding grants for Energy Efficiency. The Committee recommended for approval by the full Board a letter of support for an energy conservation and assistance grant application to be coordinated by Patrick Engineering. Motion by Bacon, seconded by Pratt to approve the minutes as written. All in favor, motion carried.

The **Road and Bridge Committee** met on February 3, 2009. The Committee met to approve January claims and other business. Discussion was held regarding the Highway Department maintenance facility at 220 North Oak in Carlinville. The Committee approved having an appraisal done on the building. The Committee requested County Engineer Reinhart obtain costs for a salt storage structure and equipment storage structure. Claims totaling \$90,966.10 were approved for payment. The Committee approved a list of surplus equipment to be sold at Konneker-Brown’s consignment auction. Reinhart gave an update on the Brighton-Bunker Hill Road project and reported that FEMA is completing the paperwork on the Stagecoach Road culvert that was washed out in the heavy rains last September. The Committee was advised the Department ordered all of the rock salt it is allowed under State contract which may not be enough for the winter. Motion by Schwallenstecker, seconded by Goodman to approve the minutes as written. All in favor, motion carried.

Goodman advised the Board after researching what the cost of having the highway building on Oak Street appraised it would be cost efficient to have a market analysis done. It was decided to seek an opinion from Assistant State’s Attorney Brent Cain regarding the sale of the property.

## **REPORTS FROM SPECIAL COMMITTEES**

The **Tourism Commission** met on January 14, 2009. The Committee discussed the website development which was presented by Sarah Black. Discussion was held on the web address, deadline to launch website and a visitors guide. Motion by Pratt, seconded by Nicholson to approve the minutes as written. All in favor, motion carried.
